

Founding the organization, assisting differently-abled children who had just passed their 10th grade to continue their education, was initial task. It demanded a level of dedication that often felt overwhelming. "Empowering through Education" became our mantra. However, the mental resilience of the children we worked with, their ability to navigate through various challenges, left us in wonder. Every question they posed became a quest for answers, leading us down diverse paths of exploration and discovery. Through various innovative approaches aimed at both their education and personal development, many success stories emerged.

For every triumph we witnessed, there were setbacks too, but they were never forgotten. Each setback was a lesson, enriching our experience. We identified various segments within the differently-abled community, addressed their unique needs and found new avenues for learning while seeking answers to their pertinent questions.

The victories were not just ours to celebrate; they belonged to every individual who contributed to our cause. Recognizing diverse groups within the differently-abled community, seeking answers to their pertinent questions, led to the discovery of innovative solutions and opened doors to new possibilities. As we look back at the highs and lows of our journey, one thing remains certain: amidst the challenges, we found countless opportunities to learn and grow.

During the academic year 2023-2024, we welcomed 2 new candidates while continuing to provide financial support to 9 candidates from previous batch. In the current year, our support structure encompasses individuals affected by cerebral palsy, partial blindness, and hearing impairments.

In this journey of 15 years, we have noticed a remarkable decrease in the number of candidates with locomotor disabilities, whereas there is a rise in incoming candidates with hearing impairments from rural areas of Marathwada region. Disabilities are evolving, presenting new challenges on the horizon. In response to this changing landscape, we have already adjusted our perspective and embraced inclusivity as a core objective. We are dedicated to providing comprehensive assistance & resources to these individuals, ensuring the necessary support to thrive and overcome challenges.

We are delighted to announce that the second candidate of Make My Dream Foundation is on the verge of completing the Bachelor of Engineering, despite being affected by Cerebral Palsy. This accomplishment is a testament to their determination and resilience and we are incredibly proud to support them on their journey towards success.

In January 2024, we achieved a significant milestone by completing our fifth Cochlear Implant project for candidate Jiya Shaikh. We are pleased with our progress, as it aligns with our goal of carrying out at least one project annually to support individuals with hearing impairments. We firmly believe that addressing the needs of the hearing impaired is crucial in today's world and we are committed to continuing our efforts in this direction.

On December 3rd, 2023, we achieved a remarkable win by organizing a trekking expedition for 12 hearing impaired individuals and 6 locomotor impaired individuals. The expedition took them to Malhargad Fort, where they experienced joy and fulfilment beyond imagination.

After completing 7 treks, they have become accustomed to annual trekking

expeditions and eagerly anticipate the next adventure as soon as one concludes. This newfound enthusiasm reflects their unwavering belief in their ability to conquer any challenge and transform their dreams into reality.

During this year, many of our former students achieved significant milestones in their lives. Some secured employment, while others celebrated the joyous occasion of marriage, marking a new chapter of stability and fulfilment. Additionally, a few were recognized with prestigious awards for their exceptional contributions in their respective fields, showcasing their dedication and talent. Furthermore, the blessing of a new baby brought immense joy and fulfilment to some. Overall, these diverse accomplishments highlight a win-win situation in life, demonstrating the multitude of ways in which our community members are thriving and finding success in various aspects of their lives.

In celebration of our 15-year journey, Make My Dream Foundation organized a State Level (Invitational) Swimming Competition for Divyang individuals on March 31, 2024. The event drew participation from a diverse group of 248 divyang participants, representing various disabilities such as physical impairment, visual impairment, hearing impairment, cerebral palsy, autism spectrum, Down syndrome, slow learner, hyperactivity & mental impairment.

This competition not only provided a platform for talent display but also instilled confidence in participants to consider future participation in national and international para swimming competitions. The widespread participation highlighted the inclusive nature of the competition. The enthusiastic turnout from rural areas underscored the importance of providing opportunities for individuals with disabilities, ensuring that talent and potential are recognized and celebrated regardless of geographical location.

The commendable dedication of parents and trainers, coupled with unwavering support from the community, played a pivotal role in the success of the event. While some participants relished the exhilaration of competition for the first time, others demonstrated remarkable expertise in para swimming, with a handful boasting prior experience in national-level competitions. This collective effort highlighted the importance of collaboration and encouragement in empowering divyang individuals to pursue their passions to the fullest extent.

Overall, the 15th anniversary celebration proved to be a truly memorable experience. The State Level Swimming Competition for Divyang individuals not only showcased the remarkable talents and determination of participants but also brought together a diverse community of supporters, parents, trainers, and volunteers. Through this event, Make My Dream Foundation reaffirmed its commitment to inclusivity and empowerment, leaving a lasting impact on all those involved. The event not only marked a significant milestone in the organization's journey but also served as a celebration of resilience, courage, and the boundless potential of individuals with disabilities.


COCHLEAR IMPLANT NO. 5 – YEAR 2024



Miss Jiya Salim Shaikh, an 8-year-old girl from Pune, was born with normal hearing and speech abilities in both ears. However, at the age of 1.5 years, she suffered from a severe viral fever, resulting in a loss of hearing in both ears. Despite numerous efforts, including consultations with specialists and the use of a powerful hearing aid from the Phonak brand, Jiya's condition did not improve.

Since 2019, Jiya has been attending the "Swarnaad" special school for hearing and speech therapy. In 2021, she transitioned to the "Unique International School" through online modules, where she is currently in the 1st standard. However, her hearing loss has presented challenges in understanding subjects, hindering her academic progress, and her speech abilities have also started deteriorating.

Jiya's parents sought the expertise of Dr. Shabbir Indorewala, a renowned ENT surgeon specializing in the rehabilitation of deaf children. After audiologic evaluation, it was confirmed that Jiya has bilateral profound hearing loss. Dr. Indorewala recommended Cochlear Implant surgery as the only viable option for Jiya's rehabilitation.




In light of their financial constraints, Jiya's parents have turned to our foundation for assistance in bridging the gap of Rs.1.70 lakhs to enable Jiya to undergo the necessary surgery and regain her hearing ability, allowing her to reintegrate into mainstream society and experience the world like any other child. After fund raising, we have paid the hospital Rs. 1.70 lakhs as aid from Make My Dream Foundation.

In January 2024, Jiya underwent successful surgery at the Indorewala ENT Hospital in Nasik, performed by Dr. Shabbir Indorewala, ENT Surgeon. She received a sound processor for her right ear, marking the beginning of her rehabilitation journey. Remarkably, Jiya began to perceive sounds immediately following the surgery, signifying a positive outcome.

With her newfound ability to hear, Jiya resumed her school, demonstrating her resilience and determination to pursue her education despite the challenges she faced. As her rehabilitation progresses, Jiya continues to adapt to her enhanced hearing abilities, paving the way for a brighter future filled with opportunities.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the generous donors who have contributed to this noble cause on behalf of Make My Dream Foundation. Mrs. Smita Samant from USA, Mrs. Mukta Gokhale from USA and Mrs. Nileema Varadan have demonstrated their unwavering support by providing financial assistance for Jiya's surgery and rehabilitation. Empowering Divyang Individuals: Recap of the State Level Swimming Competition 2024 for Divyang

Make My Dream Foundation recently organized a State Level (Invitational) Swimming Competition for Divyang individuals, held at Tilak Tank, Deccan Gymkhana, on March 31, 2024. The event garnered a remarkable response, drawing participants from various parts of the state, and creating a highly motivating atmosphere.

A total of 248 divyang children / individuals registered for the competition, showcasing a diverse range of disabilities including physical impairment, visual impairment, hearing impairment, cerebral palsy, autism spectrum, Down syndrome, slow learner, hyperactivity and mental impairment. Of these, 176 actively participated, seizing the platform to exhibit their talents and ignite the spirit of joy in fulfilling their dreams.

This competition not only provided a platform for their talents but also instilled confidence in them to consider in future national and international competitions for the para swimmers. A significant portion of the participants, hailed from various regions of Maharashtra, including Chandrapur, Nagpur, Nashik, Sambhaji Nagar, Amravati, Jalgaon, Beed, Osmanabad, Thane, Dombivli, Mumbai, Kolhapur, Sangli, Ichalkaranji, Islampur and Warananagar.

The commendable efforts of parents & trainers, alongside the support of the community, contributed to the success of the event. While some participants experienced the thrill of competition for the first time, others showcased expertise in para swimming, with a few having experience in national competitions.

The inauguration of the competition was graced by Senior Coach Shri. Vipat sir, along with Ms. Gauri Gadgil of "Yellow" movie fame & representatives from Finolex Pipes Group and Mukul Madhav Foundation, Mr. Sachin Kulkarni and Mr. Jitendra Jadhav.

The competition, held from 8 am to 4 pm, followed by a prize distribution ceremony overseen by the esteemed cricket analyst Mr. Sunandan Lele. All winners received medals, cash prizes & performance certificates. Additionally, all participants were honored with participation certificates.

The seamless coordination & management of the competition were overseen by Mrs. Sayali Thosar, the competitive coach, and her dedicated team of 54 individuals. Accessibility was ensured with the assistance of Mr. Samir Talwalkar, serving as an accessibility consultant, and Mrs. Madhuri Gadekar, who provided sign language interpretation for participants with hearing impairments. The event was further supported by 25 volunteers from Make My Dream Foundation, who tirelessly managed the administration from 8 am to 7 pm.




Amidst challenging terrains including mud, steep inclines and rocky paths, the children pressed on

"Mobility Project" - An Initiative with Different Perspective

Make My Dream Foundation remains steadfast in its mission to empower candidates towards self-reliance through carefully tailored financial support. One innovative initiative, born out of deep contemplation on fostering self-dignity, is the provision of interest-free vehicle loans. In 2014, this project came to fruition, providing special vehicles to three self-reliant ex-candidates: Irfan Pathan, Yuvraj Ahire, and Sunita Shinde. The project was made possible by the creation of an "Ear Marked Fund" totaling Rs. 2,40,000/= sourced from generous donations received specifically for this unique "Mobility Project."

We proudly announce that all three individuals have successfully repaid their loans in full. Building on this success, the project expanded in 2017 to include Akash Dasgude and Suresh Rathod, who received specially modified vehicles. While Suresh has also repaid his loan entirely, tragically, Akash's untimely demise in 2021 resulted in the unpaid portion of his loan being compassionately written off by the Trust's management. In November 2020, the project saw further expansion with the inclusion of ex-candidate Sagar Bharat, who received a specially modified vehicle. Sagar commenced repayment in January 2021.

The project's success is twofold: it ensures the responsible recycling of funds while fostering a culture of accountability among candidates, encouraging timely repayment. This not only lessens the indirect financial burden on the government & society, but also reinforces the foundation's commitment to sustainable empowerment.

Established on March 27, 2009, the Make My Dream Foundation is dedicated to the comprehensive rehabilitation of physically challenged children from economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Our mission encompasses several key objectives:

- Empowerment through Education and Self-Reliance: We strive to empower physically challenged children by providing them with access to education and fostering self-confidence, enabling them to fully participate in and contribute to an inclusive society.
- Enhanced Infrastructure for Mobility: To work towards creating basic infrastructure that facilitates hassle-free mobility for individuals with disabilities, ensuring they can navigate the world with ease and independence.
- 3. Raising Awareness and Advocacy: Through community outreach and education initiatives, we seek to raise awareness about the genuine needs of various disabled communities. We advocate for their rights and opportunities, promoting a society where all individuals can live with dignity.
- 4. Establishment of a Rehabilitation Center: Our goal is to establish a comprehensive Rehabilitation Center dedicated to providing tailored support and resources for physically challenged children, facilitating their physical, emotional, and social development.

In the fiscal year 2022-2023, in alignment with our commitment to inclusivity, we have expanded our focus to include the rehabilitation of economically disadvantaged individuals without physical disabilities. This expansion reflects our dedication to fostering a truly inclusive society where everyone, regardless of their physical abilities, has the opportunity to thrive.

Phase I - Current Project

Phase I of our initiative focuses on empowering 10th-grade students to pursue higher or vocational education, fostering self-reliance and dignity through personalized counseling. To date, we have successfully rehabilitated 68 candidates, with 12 currently benefitting from our program in the 2023-2024 fiscal year. Financial assistance for educational expenses, accommodation, transportation, study materials and other essentials until they complete their mainstream education, alongside promoting a healthy lifestyle.

Our program begins with aptitude test and counseling to explore suitable educational paths aligned with each candidate's strengths. Candidates autonomously choose their educational streams, with our unwavering support throughout the admission process into mainstream colleges, fostering inclusive learning environments.

Our candidates pursue diverse fields including engineering, fine arts, commerce, tourism, horticulture, crèche and pre-school management, culinary arts, music, and electronics/IT. Notably, 50 out of the 68 graduates are now leading independent lives, some enjoying fulfilling marriages, while others are engaged in competitive examinations.

Focus to our counseling approach is instilling the belief that despite physical challenges, they possess normal mental health. We emphasize that social support through the Make My Dream Foundation is an opportunity, not a limitation. Furthermore, we encourage them to envision a future where they contribute to society's well-being, ultimately repaying the support received by creating opportunities for other fellow sufferers.

Income Source

Our income source is through donations received from public only. We have not opted for any Government grant or aid. The foundation acknowledges that the cost of pursuing higher education is increasing and pledges to continue its efforts to reach out to deprived candidates, ensuring their access to education and support.

Phase II - Upcoming Project - Gurukul

Make My Dream Foundation is embarking on its ambitious Dream Project titled "Gurukul: An Independent Beginning." Gurukul will be a residential facility designed to support and empower both physically challenged (divyang) individuals and economically disadvantaged individuals who are physically normal. Spanning approximately 20,000 square feet on a one-acre plot within Pune City, Gurukul aims to accommodate over 50 candidates alongside essential caretakers, while also serving as a vibrant residential cultural center.

Key features of Gurukul include:

- Residential accommodation strategically located near mainstream schools and colleges.
- Vocational training facilities.
- A comprehensive medical care unit with provisions for pre and postoperative care as well as recovery services.
- Facilities for physiotherapy, a gymnasium, and yoga sessions.
- A dedicated unit for manufacturing prosthetic limbs.
- Resources such as a library with Braille books, an audio room for the hearing impaired, music rooms, art and craft sections, a computer lab, an auditorium, and a swimming pool.
- Emphasis on environmental sustainability with initiatives like horticulture, solar-powered projects, water recycling, bio-gas energy, and creating an eco-friendly environment.

For individuals with severe disabilities - Gurukul will create income generating various projects within the campus to promote self-reliance and dignity.
